Individual Narrative of Alletta⁷ Manifold Leverich [143] Daughter of Edward⁶ Leverich and Elizabeth Palmer

Alletta Manifold Leverich was born on 1 Aug 1813 at Newtown, Queens Co, New York, the daughter of Edward Leverich and Elizabeth Palmer. The birth date is a calculated date based upon Alletta's age at the time she died. 1,2,3

Edward Leverich is recorded in the 1830 U.S. Census in Newtown, Queens Co, New York. The census tallies include 1 free white female age 15 to 19, which likely was his daughter Alletta M. Leverich, who would have been 17 years old.⁴

Edward Leverich made a will dated 13 May 1835, which was proved at the Queens Co, Surrogate on 29 August 1835. One of the will's provisions granted the annual sum of one hundred fifty dollars to his five daughters, including Alletta M. Leverich.⁵

Alletta Manifold Leverich died unmarried on 1 Jun 1838 at Newtown, Queens Co, New York, age 24 years, 10 months. Alletta was buried at the Newtown Presbyterian Church.^{6,7,8}
