

**Individual Narrative of John⁷ Charles Hedenberg [147]
Son of James VanAlst Hedenberg and Elizabeth⁶ Leverich [61]
Husband of Sarah Campfield and Telazeal La Prarie**

John Charles Hedenberg¹ was born on 2 May 1792 at Newtown, Queens Co, New York, the son of James Van Alst Hedenberg and Elizabeth Leverich.^{2,3}

James Van Alst Hedenberg was the son of John Charles Hedenberg Sr (1731-1768) and Jane Van Alst. James had a brother John Charles Hedenberg Jr (1763-1818), spouse of Sarah Cadmus; and a nephew John Charles Hedenberg III (1793-1840), spouse of Margaret P. Watson.⁴

John C. Hedenberg married for the first time Sarah Campfield, daughter of Robert B. Campfield and Phoebe Ball, on 15 Feb 1816 at Newark, Essex County, New Jersey. The ceremony was performed by Rev. James Richards, pastor of the first Presbyterian Church in Newark.^{5,6}

Sarah Campfield was born 29 May 1795 at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey.⁷

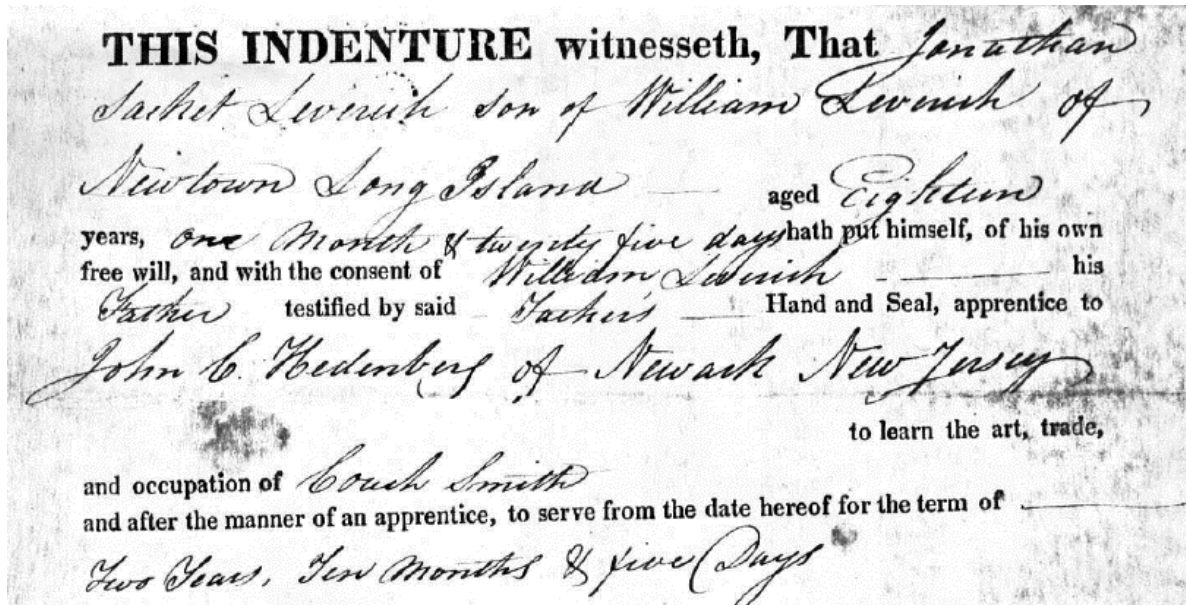
On 22 October 1816 John C. Hedenberg published the following notice in the *Centinel of Freedom*. "On Saturday evening last, between Newark and New York, or in New York, a Note of Hand of Seventy Five Dollars, payable to John C. Hedenberg, or order, draws by James Hedenberg, dated in June 1815. All persons are cautioned against taking said Note, as payment has been stopped. Any person returning said note to this Office, or to the subscriber, shall be rewarded for their trouble."⁸

The John C. Hedenberg family bible records that Sarah, wife of John C. Hedenberg, died 24 September 1826; on Sabbath morning, 15 minutes past 11 o'clock; aged 31 years, 3 months, and 26 days; "I shall be satisfied when I awake in thy likeness"; Psalm 17, v. 15.⁹

John C. Hedenberg and Sarah Campfield had three children, two of whom survived to adulthood.¹⁰

- i. Elizabeth Leverich Hedenberg was born at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey on 14 January 1818. Elizabeth married Ezekiel Morris Earl 24 October 1839 at Newark. Elizabeth died at Newark 1 June 1873 and was buried at the Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Newark. Elizabeth and Ezekiel M. Earl are not found in the U.S. Census records for 1840 through 1870. However Ezekiel is recorded in the Newark City Directory as follows: 1840-1841: 364 High St (same as father-in-law John C. Hedenberg); 1850-1851: dry goods 58 Nassau St in Manhattan, New York County, New York, residing in Jersey City, Hudson Co, New Jersey; 1859-1860: merchant, 709 Broad Street, Newark, with a residence also in San Francisco, California; 1870-1871: Elizabeth Earl, widow E. Morris Earl, 206 Clinton Avenue, Newark.^{11,12,13,14,15,16,17}
- ii. Jesse Charles Hedenberg (named after an uncle, brother to his father) was born at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey on 2 July 1821. Jesse was apparently never married. Jesse was in business with his father under the company name Hedenberg & son to conduct the Works situated at the Morris Canal Inclined Plane in Newark, as well as the Flouring business at the Flour and Grist Mill on the same premises. Jesse died at Newark 14 October 1856 at the age of 35 and was buried at Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Newark.^{18,19,20}
- iii. Ann Matilda Hedenberg was born at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey on 9 August 1824 and died as an infant at Newark on 28 August 1824.²¹

On 10 November 1826 John C. Hedenberg took on as a coach smith apprentice his first cousin once removed Jonathan Sacket Leverich. Jonathan was the son of William Leverich III. Jonathan's paternal grandfather Jesse Leverich was John's maternal uncle, brother to John's mother Elizabeth Leverich Hedenberg.²²

John C. Hedenberg married for a second time Telazeal La Prairie, adopted daughter of Alexander Innis, on 17 Jun 1829 at Newtown, Queens County, New York. Telazeal was born about 1813 in New Orleans, Louisiana. The ceremony was performed by Rev. George Shelton, the episcopal minister at St. James Church in Newtown.^{23,24,25}

John C. Hedenberg is listed as a head of household in the 1830 U.S. Census of Newark, Essex County, New Jersey. The census tallies record 1 free white male age 5 to 9 (son Jesse); 1 free white male age 30-39 (head of household John C. Hedenberg); 1 free white female age 10 to 14 (daughter Elizabeth); 1 free white female age 15 to 19 (second wife Telazeal). The household also includes one free white female age 20 to 29, and one free colored female age 10 to 23. These latter two are unidentified, but may have been hired household help.²⁶

On 21 July 1831, a citation regarding the probate of the estate of William Leverich of Newtown (brother of Elizabeth Leverich Hedenberg) was published in the *Long Island Farmer and Queens County Advertiser*. Among others, the citation is addressed to Abraham Divine Hedenberg of Augusta, Georgia, John Charles Hedenberg, Edward Leverich Hedenberg, and Richard Leverich Hedenberg, all of Newark, New Jersey.²⁷

Further probate proceedings, i.e. a list of heirs cited in 1831, includes John Charles Hedenberg, Edward Leverich Hedenberg, and Richard Leverich Hedenberg, all of Newark, NJ; James L. Hedenberg of Manhattan, New York Co, NY; David Johnson Hedenberg of Troy, Rensselaer Co, NY; and Abraham Divine Hedenberg of Augusta, Georgia.²⁸

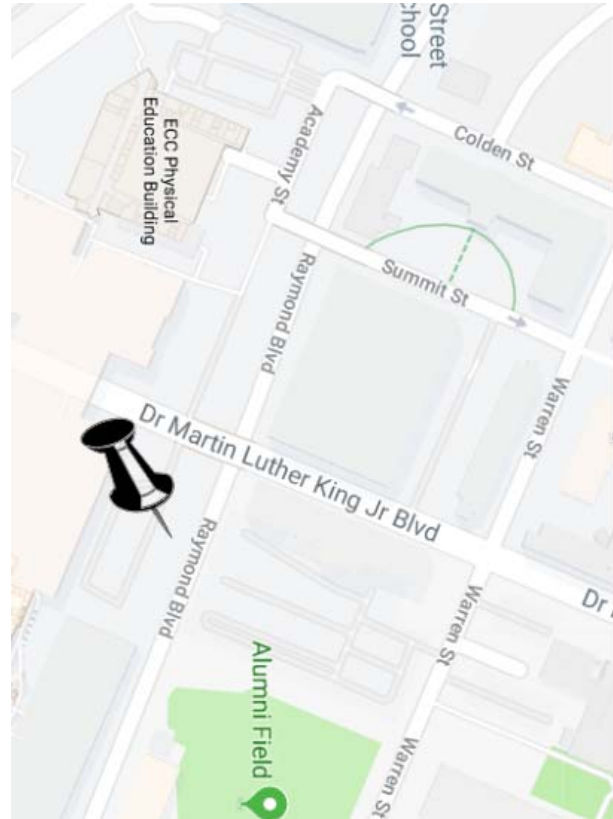
An 1841 list of heirs, at the time of the estate's final settlement, included Edward L. and John C. of Newark, David J. (no location given), Richard L of Ithaca, Thompkins Co, NY; James L and Abram D., both of Houston, Texas.²⁹

On 25 May 1833, John C. Hedenberger advertised in the *Newark Daily Advertiser*: "ONE CENT REWARD. Ranaway from the subscriber, a few day ago, an Apprentice to the Blacksmith business name, JAMES L. FOUNTAIN. He is about 19 years and 9 months of age, has a dark complexion, and is about 5 ft. 10 inches high. He came from Staten Island. All persons are warned not to harbor or trust him under the penalty of the law."³⁰

John C. Hedenberg is listed in the Newark City Directory from 1835 to 1839: Coach Manufacturer Broad corner Mechanic and Union Works foot of inclined plane; residence Orange Street; residence High 1st North Inclined Plan; residence 364 High Street.^{31,32,33,34}

The History of Newark, by Joseph Atkinson, observes that "For considerably more than half a century the manufacture of carriages and coaches has been a leading and important department of local industry. The pioneers were Stephen Wheeler, Robert B. Campfield, John C. Hedenberg (son-in-law of Campfield), and later G. & A. Carter and the lately deceased James M. Quinby ... the work turned out by Campfield and his son-in-law gave wings to the fame of Newark. Such was the celebrity of their handiwork that state carriages costing \$2000 each (a very large sum in those days), for Santa Anna, of Mexico, and Captain-General Tacon, of Cuba, were made by them upon orders from New York dealers ..." "... Newark-made carriages became famous throughout America and even in Europe ... as the following complimentary note explains ...".

New-York Nov. 10, 1836

Mr. J. C. Hedenberg, -- Newark.

Dear Sir: - I am happy in having it in my power to inform you that my friend in England is delighted with the Buggy you built for him; and so much pleased with it is his particular friend, that he has ordered a facsimile to be built there, cost what it would.

Very respectfully, yours.^{35,36}

J. C. Hedenberg is listed in the 1840-1841 Newark City Directory, "coach repos" 305 Broad St, home 364 High St. Also listed living at 364 High St is James Hedenberg, father of J.C. Hedenberg.³⁷

John C. Hedenberg is listed as a head of household in the 1840 U.S. Census of Newark, Essex County, New Jersey. The census tallies record 1 free white male age 15 to 19 (son Jesse); 1 free white male age 40 to 49 (John C. Hedenberg); 1 free white female age 15 to 19 (unidentified); 2 free white females age 20 to 29 (daughter Elizabeth and 2nd wife Telazeal); 2 persons employed in manufacture and trade (John and son Jesse). There are no tallies that would represent son William (age 10) and John's father James (age 73).³⁸

On 24 August 1841 *The Centinel of Freedom* reported that "a stalk of corn from the garden of Mr. J. C. Hedenberg of this city, fairly beats the longest of the two recently noticed. It is an inch or two short of 12 feet. Our corn fields generally look well, but will the yield of grain equal the promise of vigorous stalks? It is said that the ears are scanty."³⁹

The Newark City Directory 1841 through 1848 lists John C. Hedenberg, coachmaker, 364 High Street, 17 Park Place, then 222 Broad Street.^{40,41,42,43,44,45,46}

On 5 December 1842 the *Newark Daily Advertiser* reported that "John C. Hedenberg of Essex Co, to be declared a Bankrupt, Tuesday December 13, 1842, at 10 o'clock A.M. at Paterson."⁴⁷

On 13 July 1843 the *Newark Daily Advertiser* reported that "the subscribers entered into partnership on the 13th day of June last, under the firm of Hedenberg & Son, to conduct the Works situated at the Morris Canal Inclined Plane in this city, and to carry on the Flouring business at the Flour and Grist Mill on the same premises. Newark July 8 1843. John C. Hedenberg. Jesse C. Hedenberg."⁴⁸

On 25 March 1844, the New York Tribune reported on "Another Destructive Fire in Newark." "The extensive establishment on the Inclined Plane of the Morris Canal in Newark known as 'Hedenberg's Union Works,' was totally destroyed by fire early on Saturday morning ... the flames broke out about half past 2 o'clock in the southwest angle of the large pile of four story buildings, and are supposed to have originated in the annealing furnace of Messrs. Gardner, Harrison & Co.'s Foundry, situated in that quarter. They soon extended to each wing - the Grist Mill (of messrs. Hedenberg & son) on the one side and the India Rubber Factory ... on the other -- and from the combustible nature of their contents the flames spread with great rapidity through the whole range; and the Fire Department seemed put at defiance by the fearful rage of the conflagration, and was compelled to witness its inevitable destruction and direct their attention to the adjacent houses. The heat was most intense and a still breeze from the north overspread several squares South with a dense shower of fire and sparks, endangering many dwellings in its course. A two story frame building on the opposite side of the Canal in Academy Street, owned by Jesse C. Hedenberg, and occupied for carriage jobbing, caught and was burnt to ashes ... The destruction of this immense establishment is to be deplored as a public calamity ... the loss is incalculable. The buildings and machinery belonging to the Messrs. Hedenberg could not be replaced for \$4,000 ... We add the items of the loss of the various individuals as far as we have been able to collect them, with the

amount of insurance: Hedenberg & son, Buildings, Machinery, Stock, etc ... loss of \$10,000, Insurance of \$13,000 ... There were nearly 200 persons in the establishment, now thrown out of employment ... the 'Union Works', thus destroyed, comprised three or four large three and four story brick buildings which were erected in 1835 ... and subsequently purchased by Mr. John C. Hedenberg for a coach factory.⁴⁹ⁿ

The following notice appeared in the *Newark Daily Advertiser* on 5 October 1847. NOTICE. The partnership heretofore existing between the subscribers in the proprietorship and management of 'Hedenberg Works' in this city, under the style of HEDENBERG & SON, is this day dissolved by mutual consent, and by the withdrawal of John C. Hedenberg, who has taken the Water Power privilege and premises at Rahway, known as the 'Taurine Mills' where hereafter he may be found ready to accommodate manufacturers with rooms and power for the steady prosecution of their business. The business of the late firm will be settled by Jess C Hedenberg, who now holds sole interest in 'Hedenberg Works' at the Inclined Plane, in this city, and will hereafter conduct the same upon his own individual account. Newark, Oct. 4, 1847. JOHN C. HEDENBERG, JESSE C. HEDENBERG.⁵⁰ⁿ

The Newark City Directory for 1848 through 1850 lists John C. Hedenberg, *Rahway Works*.^{51,52}

On 17 October 1849 the *Newark Daily Advertiser* reported that "Hundreds of Passengers for California. -- The steamships Ohio and Empire City left New York yesterday with 642 passengers, chiefly for California via Chagres (Atlantic Port in Panama) ... Among the passengers on the Empire City are Mr. James M. Crane, who goes out to establish the *California Whig* at San Francisco, and N. Doane and lady, missionaries to Oregon ... Mr. John C. Hedenberg, long an enterprising manufacturer of this city, is also among the passengers of the Empire City."⁵³ⁿ

John C. Hedenberg (age 60, merchant) is listed in the 1850 U.S. Census of Sacramento, Sacramento Co, California. Residing in the same household are John's son William A. Hedenberg (age 20, clerk) and John's brother Jas Hedenberg (age 63, merchant). Also living in the household are Stephen H. Mecker, A.R. Baldwin, Eldridge Delong, and David Mecker. John C. Hedenberg's wife Telazeal Hedenberg is not recorded.⁵⁴

Although John C. Hedenberg had relocated to Sacramento, California, he continued to retain a financial interest in the Rahway Works in New Jersey, as listed in the Newark New Jersey City Directory 1850 to 1855.^{55,56,57,58,59}

John C. Hedenberg, merchant (age not legible) is recorded in the 1852 California State Census in Sacramento, California. Also included in the household is Mrs. Hedenberg (age 40, born Louisiana), W. A. Hedenberg (age 27, merchant), and Hannah Hedenberg (age 18, wife of W. A. Hedenberg).⁶⁰

The 1853-1854 Sacramento City Directory includes the following listings: Hedenberg & Co, hardware merchants, 231 J Street; John C. Hedenberg of Hedenberg & Co, dwelling I Street, between 6th and 7th, Sacramento - New Jersey; William A. Hedenberg of Hedenberg & Co, 231 J Street Sacramento - New Jersey.⁶¹

The 1855-1857 Newark (NJ) City Directories include a listing for "John C. Hedenberg, California."^{62,63n}

During his years living in Newark, John C. Hedenberg was engaged in extensive real estate speculation. From 1826 to 1857 John was a party to 138 land transactions in Newark. See Appendix for a listing.⁶⁴

"J.C. Hedenberg", age 70, born New York is listed in the 1860 U.S. Census of Sacramento, Ward 3, Sacramento Co, California. Also listed is "T. Hedenberg", probably his wife Telazeal. Her age is incorrectly given as 40, but she was actually 47. Her birth place is given as Louisiana.⁶⁵

The 1861 Newark (NJ) City Directory lists John C. Hedenberg, California. Also listed is William A. Hedenberg, Park House Hotel, Newark. The 1861-1862 Sacramento, California City Directory lists J. C. Hedenberg, clerk, 227 J St, residence north side G St between 7th and 8th. Also listed is W. A. Hedenberg of Meeker & Hedenberg, carriage and wagon material, 227 J St, residence Newark, New Jersey.^{66,67}

The San Francisco City Directory for the year commencing October 1864 lists John C. Hedenberg living at 438 Natoma Street.⁶⁸

On 7 July 1866, John Charles Hedenberg was recorded in the California Great Register, a list of eligible voters compiled at the County level as required by the 1866 Registry Act. This record identifies John as age 74, born in New York, a Gentleman, living in Sacramento.⁶⁹

The 1868 Sacramento (CA) City Directory records the following: J.C. Hedenberg, residence G Street between 7th and 8th; W.A. Hedenberg & Co, wagon material, 235 J St - NJ.⁷⁰

Telazeal Hedenberg died 18 December 1869 at Sacramento, California. Her death record records that Telazeal was age 56 years, 11 months, and 21 days. She died of kidney disease, according to the attending physician Dr. Hatch. Telazeal was buried at the Sacramento City Cemetery.^{71,72}

John C. Hedenberg and Telazeal La Prarie had one child: William Alexander Henry Hedenberg.

- i. William was born at Newark, Essex County, New Jersey 23 July 1830. William married Frances A. Dayton 30 December 1858 at Newark. William Hedenberg died at Manhattan, New York County, New York on 17 April 1903 and was buried at Woodlawn Cemetery, Bronx Co, New York. William lived at Newark, New Jersey (1860 U.S. Census); Sacramento, California (1862 and 1872 City Directories); and Manhattan, New York County, New York (1870 and 1900 U.S. Census). William lived in Newark where he operated a coach making factory, while at the same time remotely operating a wagon supply business in Sacramento, where his father John C. Hedenberg was living.^{73,74,75,76,77,78,79,80,81}

John C. Hedenberg died on 31 Dec 1874 at Sacramento, Sacramento, California, at age 82 years, 7 months, and 29 days. He was buried in Sacramento City Cemetery.^{82,83,84}
