Individual Narrative of Edward⁷ Leverich Hedenberg [149] Son of James VanAlst Hedenberg and Elizabeth⁶ Leverich [61] Husband of Sarah Pierson Halsey

Edward Leverich Hedenberg¹ was born on 14 May 1797 at Newtown, Queens Co, New York, the son of James Van Alst Hedenberg and Elizabeth Leverich.²

The "L" middle initial for Edward L. Hedenberg was recorded both as "Lemuel" and "Leverich". The book *Thomas Halsey of Hertfordshire, England and Southampton, Long Island, 1891-1679* identifies Edward as Edward "Lemuel" Hedenberg. This is picked up and repeated in several public family trees at Ancestry.com.

However, The following notice was published in the *Long Island Farmer* on 21 July 1831. "The people of the State of New York, by the Grace of God Free and Independent, to all whom these presents shall come, or may concern, and especially to James Leverich and Abraham Divine Hedenberg, of Augusta, state of Georgia, and John Charles Hedenberg, Edward Leverich Hedenberg, and Thomas Cowgill and Elizabeth his wife, of Newark, State of New Jersey, next of kin to William Leverich, late of the town of Newtown in the county of Queens and the State of New York, deceased ...

Greetings. You are hereby cited and required personally to be and appear before our Surrogate of our county of Queens ... on Monday the fifteenth day of August next ... to attend to the probate of a certain instrument in writing, purporting to be the last Will and Testament of the said William Leverich, deceased, which will then and there be offered for that purpose". "Leverich" as the middle name is picked up and recorded in other public family trees at Ancestry.com.

No further evidence supporting "Lemuel" has been identified. "Leverich" as the middle name appears more likely since Edward L. Hedenberg's mother Elizabeth had a brother Edward Leverich. In addition, several of Edward L. Hedenberg's brothers have "Leverich" for a middle name.^{3,4}

Edward L. Hedenberg married Sarah Pierson Halsey, daughter of Jacob Benton Halsey and Mary Wheeler, on 3 Oct 1822 at Newark, Essex, New Jersey.⁵ Sarah Pierson Halsey was born 3 October 1803 in Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey.^{6,7}

Edward L. Hedenberg is listed as a head of household in the 1830 U.S. Census of Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey. The census tallies record 1 free white male under the age of 5 (son Jacob); 1 free white male age 30 to 39 (Edward L. Hedenberg); 1 free white female age 5 to 9 (daughter Emma); 1 free white female age 10 to 14 (unidentified); 1 free white female age 20 to 29 (wife Sarah).⁸

Further probate proceedings for William Leverich, i.e. a list of heirs cited in 1831, includes John Charles Hedenberg, Edward Leverich Hendenberg, and Richard Leverich Hedenberg, all of Newark, NJ; James L. Hedenberg of Manhattan, New York Co, NY; David Johnson Hedenberg of Troy, Rensellaer Co, NY; and Abraham Divine Hedenberg of Augusta, Georgia.

An 1841 list of heirs, at the time of the estate's final settlement, included Edward L. and John C. of Newark, David J. (no location given), Richard L of Ithaca, Tompkins Co, NY; James L and Abram D., both of Houston, Texas.^{9,10}

Edward L. Hedenberg is listed in the 1834 to 1836 New York City Directories: coachmaker, 51 Leonard; residence 33 Mott, then 138 Franklin.^{11,12,13}

Edward L. Hedenberg is listed as a head of household in the 1840 U.S. Census of Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey. The census tallies record 1 free white male age 10 to 14 (son Jacob); 1 free white male age 40 to 49 (Edward L. Hedenberg); 1 free white female age 15 to 19 (daughter Emma); 1 free white female age 20 to 29 (unidentified); 1 free white female age 30 to 39 (wife Sarah).¹⁴

Edward L. Hedenberg is listed in the 1840 to 1843 Newark (NJ) City Directories: coachmaker 8 Lawrence, residence 66 Mulberry; Hedenberg and Littell, light carriage manufacturers 8 Lawrence.^{15,16}

On 15 March 1842 the *Newark Daily Advertiser* published the following notice: "Copartnership Notice -- The subscribers have entered into copartnership under firm of Hedenberg & Littell, and will manufacture light carriages of all kinds at 8 Lawrence at Newark, N.J. Edward L. Hedenberg. Wm. M. Littell.¹⁷

Edward L. Hedenberg is listed in the 1845-1849 Newark City Directories: coach manufacturer 210 Market St, residence 66 Mulberry; Hedenberg & Littell, light carriage manufacturer, 210 Market.^{18,19}

Edward L. Hedenberg, age 53, coachmaker, is recorded in the 1850 U.S. Census of Newark East Ward, Essex Co, New Jersey. Other members of the household included his wife Sarah P. Hedenberg, age 48; and his son E. L. Hedenberg, age 7. Listed in the census record immediately adjacent is the household of Edward's daughter Emma S. Littell, her husband William M. Littell, coachmaker, and their family.²⁰

Edward L. Hedenberg is listed in the 1854-1859 Newark City Directories: coach manufacturer 210 Market St, residence 84 Mulberry; Hedenberg & Littell, light carriage manufacturer, 210 Market.^{21,22}

Edward L. Hedenberg, age 63, coachmaker, is recorded in the 1860 U.S. Census of Newark Ward 4, Essex Co, New Jersey. Other members of the household included his wife Sarah P. Hedenberg, age 57; and his son Edward L. Hedenberg, age 17. Also listed living in the household is Edward's daughter Emma S. Littell, her husband William M. Littell, coachmaker, and their family.²³

Edward L. Hedenberg is listed in the 1864-1865 Newark City Directory, coachmaker, 84 Mulberry St.²⁴

Sarah P. Hedenberg died 3 October 1866 at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey, then living at 84 Mulberry St. She was buried at Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Newark.^{25,26}

Sarah P. Hedenberg made a will dated 4 June 1866, with a codicil dated 4 September 1866. The will was proved 7 March 1867. Heirs listed included husband Edward L. Hedenberg, daughter and son-in-law Emma S. Littell and Willam M. Littell Sr, and sons J. Halsey Hedenberg and Edward L. Hedenberg Jr. Executors named were half brother George Holden Sr, daughter Emma, and son Edward. Sarah left her heirs the proceeds of several securities, but her will made no reference to her residence or her husband's coachmaking business. A separate will and probate for her husband Edward L. Hedenberg has not been found.²⁷

Edward L. Hedenberg is listed in the 1869-1870 Newark (NJ) City Directory: coachmaker 260 Market Street, residence 102 Mulberry St.²⁸

Edward Leverich Hedenberg died on 14 Oct 1870 at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey, at age 73. He was buried at the Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Newark. His obituary appeared in the Newark Daily Journal on 15 October 1870. "About twelve o'clock last night Mr. Edward L. Hedenberg, a resident of this city for nearly sixty years, went to his eternal rest, at his residence No. 102 Mulberry street. His taking—off was sudden and unexpected. For two weeks past he had been ailing off and on, but his malady, internal hemorrhage, seemed to be improving rather than otherwise. Yesterday morning he was downstairs, but twelve or fourteen hours subsequently he was a corpse. Deceased was well and favorably known throughout this community for his various traits of manly character. As a business man his reputation, like his paper, was spotless. He was long a member of the carriage—making firm of Hedenberg & Littell. Thus the old stand—bys of Newark are passing away - passing away!^{29,30,31}"

Edward Leverich Hedenberg and Sarah Pierson Halsey had three children.^{32,33}

- i. Emma Selena Hedenberg was born at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey on 11 January 1824. Emma married William Meeker Littell Sr. 16 November 1843 at the First Presbyterian Church in Newark. Emma died at Newark 19 March 1900 and was buried at the Mount Pleasant Cemetery in Newark. Emma and William are found in the U.S. Census of Newark in 1850, 1860, and 1880, but not 1870. However, William is listed in the 1870-1871 Newark City Directory living at 102 Mulberry Street.^{34,35,36,37,38,39,40,41,42}
- ii. Jacob Halsey Hedenberg was born at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey on 3 May 1826. Jacob married Caroline Armstrong Van Antwerp 1 September 1822 at Brooklyn, Kings Co, New York. Jacob died at Brooklyn 15 March 1901 and was buried at Mt. Pleasant Cemetery in Newark. Jacob is found in the 1860 and 1880 U.S. Census and 1865 New York State Census in Brooklyn. Jacob is found in the 1900 U.S. Census in Wayne, Passaic Co, New Jersey.^{43,44,45,46,47,48,49,50,51,52}
- Edward Leverich Hedenberg Jr was born at Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey on 11 August 1843. Edward married Georgia Anna Ackerman 12 September 1866 at Newark. Edward died at Cranford, Union Co, New Jersey on 12 February 1925. Edward is listed in the 1860 U.S. Census in Newark; in the 1875 New York State Census in Brooklyn Ward 24, Kings Co, New York; in the 1880 U.S. Census in Ulster, Ulster Co, New York; in the 1900, 1910, and 1920 U.S. Census in Cranford, Union Co, New Jersey.

Between 1834 and 1852, Edward L. Leverich was a party to 16 real estate transactions in Newark, New Jersey.⁶³
