

**Individual Narrative of James<sup>7</sup> L. Hedenberg [146]  
Son of James VanAlst Hedenberg and Elizabeth<sup>6</sup> Leverich [61]  
Husband of Eliza M. Van Orden**

James L. Hedenberg was born on 30 Jan 1790 at Newtown, Queens, New York, the son of James Van Alst Hedenberg and Elizabeth Leverich. His gravestone records that James was born on "Long Island."<sup>1</sup>

James married Eliza M. Van Orden on 30 Jan 1812 at Manhattan, New York, New York.<sup>2</sup> The parents of Eliza M. Van Orden have not been identified. Eliza likely was born between 1791 and 1800, according to the census tallies in the 1830 U.S. Census: 1 free white female age 30 to 39 in the household of James L. Leverich, Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey. Her place of birth has not been identified. Neither her date nor place of death or burial have been identified.<sup>3</sup>

The New York City Directory records a James Hedenberg, Grocer, in the years 1813 through 1816 - 1813 and 1814 Orange corner Hester. The 1814 record also lists James Hedenberg and Son John, 159 Church. Both the 1815 and 1816 directories record James Hedenberg, grocer, 159 Church. This could not have been the James Hedenberg, son of James and Elizabeth, since James and Eliza Hedenberg were married in 1812 and did not have any children in 1814.<sup>4,5,6,7</sup>

James L. Hedenberg served in the New York State militia in 1814. For the period 2 September to 2 October, James was a corporal in the company of Captain Alexander McClure, the first regiment of Col. W. W. Laight. For the period October 2 to December 3, James was a sergeant in the company of Captain Alexander McClure, the first regiment (detached) of Col. Edward W. Haight.<sup>8</sup>

The 1816 through 1818 New York City Directory lists a James L. Hedenberg, Carpenter: 90 Warren, 9 Warren, and St. John's Hall Frankfort.<sup>9,10,11</sup>

The 1819 and 1820 New York City Directory does not include a listing for a James Hedenberg. James Hedenberg is not found in the 1820 U.S. Census in New York.<sup>12,13,14</sup>

James L. Hedenberg was identified as a mason in December 1820, a member of Mount Moriah Lodge No. 132 in New York City.<sup>15</sup>

The 1821 New York City Directory lists James (no middle initial) Hedenberg, carpenter, 44 Provost. There is no street called "Provost" on a contemporary map of Manhattan. The 1807 Bridges map of Manhattan shows a Provoost Street between North Moore and Harrison Street, running east from West Street. This location is three blocks north of Duane Street where James L. Hedenberg and Eliza M. Van Orden were married.<sup>16,17</sup>

James L. Hedenberg is not found in the New York City Directory during the years 1822 through 1830.<sup>18,19,20,21,22,23,24,25,26</sup>

In a deed dated 3 November 1827, James Hedenberg (father) was the grantor to James L. Hedenberg (son), grantee, in consideration of \$148.00, a lot bordering southerly side of Hamilton Street near Mulberry St and the First Presbyterian Church in Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey. On 7 October 1828, James Hedenberg reacquires the property in a Sheriff's sale, then sells the lot to James M. Miller in a deed dated 6 January 1830. On 14 January 1832 James L. Hedenberg sells a neighboring lot, northerly side of Hamilton St near Mulberry St and the First Presbyterian Church to James M. Miller for \$1.00.<sup>27</sup>

James L. Hedenberg may have been living in Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey during the period 1822-1829. James, as well as his brothers John C. Hedenberg and Edward Hedenberg, are all found as heads of family in the 1830 U.S. Census of Newark, Essex Co, New Jersey. The census tallies for James' household in 1830 include 1 free white male age 40 to 49 (James); 1 free white female age 30 to 39 (wife Eliza M.); 1 free white male age 10 to 14 (son Charles); 2 free white males age 15 to 19 (unidentified); 2 free white females age 15 to 19 (daughter Margaret, one unidentified); 2 free white males and 1 free white female age 20 to 29 (all unidentified).<sup>28</sup>

The 1831 New York City Directory lists James L. Hedenberg, carpenter, 47 Provost.<sup>29</sup>

William Leverich, a brother of Elizabeth Leverich Hedenberg, died in 1831. Probate proceedings in 1831 contained a list of heirs which included John Charles Hedenberg, Edward Leverich Hendenberg, and Richard Leverich Hedenberg, all of Newark, NJ; James L. Hedenberg of Manhattan, New York Co, NY; David Johnson Hedenberg of Troy, Rensselaer Co, NY; and Abraham Divine Hedenberg of Augusta, Georgia.<sup>30</sup>

An 1841 list of heirs, at the time of the estate's final settlement, included Edward L. and John C. of Newark, David J. (no location given), Richard L of Ithaca, Thompkins Co, NY; James L and Abram D., both of Houston, Texas.<sup>31</sup> James L. Hedenberg was a signatory of a Memorial of Merchants, Mechanics of the City of New York, against a renewal of the charter of the Bank of the United States, submitted to the 23rd U.S. Congress, first session, in February 1834.<sup>32</sup>

The 1835 New York City Directory lists James L. Hedenberg, carpenter, 5 North Moore Street.<sup>33</sup>

By 1837-1838, children of James L. Hedenberg, i.e. Charles J. Hedenberg and his sister Margaret Hedenberg, had settled in Bastrop, Bastrop County, Texas, southeast of Austin, Texas.<sup>34</sup>

The following notice was published on 5 April 1838 in the New York Evening Post: "Fifth Ward: At a large and respectable meeting of the Democratic electors ... Resolved, that the following persons be constituted a Vigilance Committee during the three days of this election". The list includes James L. Hedenberg.<sup>35</sup>

Pierson's Newark City (NJ) Directory does not include a listing for James L. Hedenberg. It does include listings for his father James, and his brothers Abram (harness), J.C. (coach manufacturer), and Richard L. (coach maker).<sup>36</sup>

The 1839-1840 New York City Directory lists James L. Hedenberg, carpenter, 44 Bank St.<sup>37</sup> James L. Hedenberg is not found in the 1840 U.S. Census in New York or New Jersey.<sup>38,39</sup> James L. Hedenberg is not found listed in the 1840-1841 Newark, New Jersey City Directory. This directory does include listings for James' father James, and his brothers Abram, Edward L., and J.C.<sup>40</sup> James L. Hedenberg is not found listed in the New York City Directories 1841 through 1847.<sup>41,42,43,44,45,46,47</sup>

On 14 March 1847, James L. Hedenberg recorded the title for a land patent, 640 acres located in the Colorado District, Fayette County, Texas.<sup>48</sup>

The 1850 U.S. Census of Sacramento, Sacramento Co, California records Jno. C. Hedenberg (merchant, age 60, born NJ - actually age 58, born NY), his son William A. Hedenberg (clerk, age 20, born NJ), and in the same household his brother Jas Hedenberg (merchant, age 63, born Michigan: actually age 60, born NY). Also included in the same household are Stephen H. Mecker, David Mecker, A. R. Baldwin, and Eldridge Delong.<sup>49</sup>

J. L. Hedenberg, carpenter, age 70, born in New York, is recorded in the 1860 U.S. Census in Bastrop, Bastrop Co, Texas. He is living in the household of C. K. Hall, his merchant son-in-law, and his daughter Margaret M. Hall, age 45, born New York. The household also includes two children, "Catar" (Katie) Hall, age 14, born Texas; and Mary E. Hall, age 3, born New Jersey.<sup>50</sup>

James L. Hedenberg died in Feb 1862 at Bastrop, Bastrop, Texas, at age 72.<sup>51</sup> He was buried at Fairview Cemetery in Bastrop. James L. Hedenberg apparently did not leave a will. The Family Search probate index for Bastrop Co, Texas does not disclose any estate records for James.<sup>52</sup>



James L. Hedenberg and Eliza Van Orden had at least two children surviving to adulthood. The 1860 U.S. Census for the household of Margaret Hall in Bastrop, Texas includes James L. Hedenberg. *Lubbock's memoirs* identify Charles Hedenberg as the brother of Margaret Hall, wife of C.K. Hall, of Bastrop, Texas. The 1830 U.S. Census tallies for the household of James L. Hedenberg in Newark, New Jersey indicate the possibility of 2 additional sons and 1 additional daughter that may be unidentified.<sup>53,54,55</sup>

- i. Margaret Hedenberg was born at Newtown, Queens Co, New York on 26 December 1814. Margaret married Constant K. Hall 8 March 1840 at Houston, Harris Co, Texas. Margaret likely was the Margaret Hall who died 8 January 1879 at Cumby, Hopkins Co, Texas and was buried at the Pleasant Grove Cemetery there. Margaret's husband and daughter were buried in Fairview Cemetery, Bastrop, Texas but Margaret is not found buried there. Margaret and Constant are recorded in the 1850 and 1860 U.S. Census of Bastrop, Bastrop Co, Texas. Margaret and Constant are recorded in the 1870 U.S. Census of Austin, Travis Co, Texas.<sup>56,57,58,59,60,61</sup>
- ii. Charles J. Hedenberg was born at Newtown, Queens Co, New York about 1818. About 1837, Charles is found at Houston, Harris Co, Texas, a partner in the firm Hedenberg & Vedder, commission merchants and proprietors of an auction store. Charles married Mary Ellen Higginbotham 9 July 1841 at Davidson, Davidson County, Tennessee. On 4 February 1847 Charles J. Hedenberg recorded a land patent for 320 acres in Limestone Co, Texas. By 1850, Charles and his family had removed to the State of Pennsylvania. Charles is recorded in the 1850 and 1860 U.S. Census of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Picture Agent, then Publisher. Charles is recorded in the 1870 U.S. Census of Danville, Montour Co, Pennsylvania, druggist. Charles died at Danville 3 February 1873, and was buried at Woodland Cemetery in Philadelphia.<sup>62,63,64,65,66,67,68,69,70</sup>
